Looking at the J-80 Polar it is like a cruising boat polar, so 180 downwind gives you best VMG. So the shortest possible way is the fastest, given no big differences in windspeed on racetrack. Because of this my main idea was to concentrate at any turn, as this was the key to either win or get 20th.

Right at the beginning Nacrr offered me a bet who would be faster at finish. As Hmm was off for IRL sailing, it was my turn to defend the honour of the engine room. I knew I had to sail better then I could. So supplied with a few cold beers, I counted at every single turn to get it as close as possible. The most time around the racecourse Nacrr, Kroppyer, Outlaw and me were in the top 4, devided by 0.01 to 0.02nm. Very close to say the least.
