Rankings by Nation Quarterly update from SRC 2019 end of Q2

At the end of the second Quarter 2019, or 47 races in all, we can look at a "provisional" situation carrying important changes and evolution. The fight for top spots both individual and Team has increased in momentum and the result promises to be highly uncertain till the very end of the year.

In Detail:

INDIVIDUAL: Finland, thanks to a super-performance in Q2 has taken the lead with 12 victories and is chased in second position by **Poland** with 7.

The fight for Bronze includes some 8 Nations with points from 2 to 4. Any of them will be able to grab bronze in the end, whilst it seem difficult at this time for anyone to endanger Finland's and Poland's positions.

TEAM:

The major change in Q2 has been that **Italy** has reached and overtaken Denmark in the provisional lead , and for now is in command with 18 points. **Denmark** is at this time firmly in second position with 13 victories .

Like at the end of Q1 the above two teams have placed some distance between them and the third and Bronze runner up team , **Australia** with 7 scores. For all the others getting into the top three spots seems very difficult at this stage.

SKIPPER: (For medals)

As most of you are by now aware this year we have a new scheme aimed to reward that Skipper (Individual) or those Three Skippers (Team) who more than others have contributed to the final position of his/her/their National Flag in the Rankings by Nation. The new scheme rewards participation as well as results.

We are now in the position , at the end of this second quarter , to simulate which Skippers would be rewarded **IF** the situation would be that of year end 2019 :

INDIVIDUAL SKIPPER:

Finland as you have seen is in **GOLD** position. The Finnish Skipper with more points than any other one is **ij**, with 144 points. If this will be the result at the end of 2019 he would receive a large Gold Medal to record his achievement in the Rankings by Nation (Individual).

Poland is today in **SILVER** position. The Polish Skipper with more points than any other one is **WRmirekd** with 197 points. If this will be the result at the end of 2019 he would receive a large SILVER medal to record his achievement in the Rankings by Nation (Individual).

Italy is at this time in **BRONZE** position, in a tie with Australia , but leading thanks to better finish in third position (7 to 5) and the Italian Skipper with best score over other Italians, in as far as individual results is **RICOTINA** with 88 points. If this will be the result at the end of 2019 he would receive a large Bronze Medal to record his achievement in the Rankings by Nation (Individual).

Hopefully reading the above simulation everyone will enjoy a better understanding of the Skippers reward mechanicals for Nations Rankings. (Individual)

TEAM SKIPPERS:

Italy is leading the Team rankings and the three skippers with best "Italian Team by Nation" score are: brandystrega (512), AL53_SSIta (488) and RICOTINA (466). If we were now at year's end these three skippers would receive (each) a Gold large medal for Team rankings by Nation for Italy's victory in the scheme.

Denmark is in SILVER at the moment, and the three Skippers with best "Danish" Team score are: **Bimmer (635)**, **Wolff (557)** and **Mouthansar (494)**. If we were now at year's end these three skippers would receive (each) a Silver large medal for Team rankings by Nation for Denmark's second place in the scheme.

Australia is comfortable in BRONZE position at the moment, and the three skippers with best "Australian" Team score are: **Kipper1258 (810)**, **Tyger (579)** and **intermezzo (545)**. If we were now at year's end these three skippers would receive (each) a Bronze large medal for Team rankings by Nation for Australia's third place in the scheme.

Hopefully reading the above simulation everyone will enjoy a better understanding of the Skippers reward mechanicals for Nations Rankings. (Team)
