Lord Howe 2020

Report by **Galmoli**

It has been 3 years since my last online race and 5 years since my last real race. This has been my second regatta at SOL and in the short time I have been here I have seen how great the community is. I felt like I was at home.

I don't have any screenshot from the first 10h of the race but it was really demanding for me because I don't have enough practice with DCs and server ticks. I managed to not BBQ and I only lost 1 minute to the lead in the first mark.

After the first mark I started to plan the route. There were 2 (more or less) clear routes. The first one with more wind pressure but with a longer path. I started to create several routes with QT forcing the route to go further south than it showed me, I wanted to see how much time would be lost with the current WX. If I remember correctly the difference was between 10 and 15 minutes. With the current WX prediction it wasn't worth it.

My objective was to score a Top 15 and I knew that following the current QT route would be enough because I don't know how to use AGL and the more experienced player would outperform me.

I threw some more south routes with different wind pressures. I needed a WX update that bringed 4% more wind pressure in the south to outperform the original route. I took the risk but I didn't go all in, so I took a moderate south route.

When I got up early in the morning I was in the right spot. The 4:20 WX update played in my favour. Now it was time to defend so I could get a place in the Top 15.



My first defense maneuver was to approach the main fleet (the green dotted line is my original route). I knew I couldn't do anything with **@Zorba777** because he was too south and I decided to defend from the rest of the fleet rather than persueue the win.

As I knew that I wouldn't be home all day and seeing the situation of a possible Top 10, I decided to take the laptop with me so I could update the DCs with the new WX updates.

When the < 1 kn winds went in all my DCs were wrong so I decided to race setting the cog by hand. But I didn't delete old DCs so I did a strange maneuver.



At that moment the closest boat that I had was **@Kerran** from Sweden, so gybed in front of him to defend from a possible wind shift.

After this gybe the path to the north started so we could get stronger winds and a better angle to approach the finish line, at that moment I was already in the Top 5.

Approaching the last tack I decided that I would tack after **@rumskib** and **@brandystrega**. I made the decision because although tacking soon would bring me closer to the finish line, being further east would mean having less wind pressure and less angle.

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I tacked in front of **@rumskib** and set the DCs to get to the finish line.

I spend more time planning on how to defend from the main fleet rather than going for the lead. Next time I will go for it **@Zorba777**;)
