



SOL RACE RECORD

Back in the early 1980s, Class 1, Two Ton Cup, Mini-Maxi and Maxi yachts like Syd Fischer's Ragamuffin IV, Edmond de Rothschild's Gitana VII and Jim Kilroy's Kialoa V, all designed by Argentina's German Frers, regularly took line honours, corrected time or level rating victories around the World.

These serial successes, less reliant on light displacement than some others, drove a growing popularity of Frers' designs for 30ft to 40ft cruiser racers. Thus when Janice and Barry Carroll founded Carroll Marine in Rhode Island in 1984, they were happy to acquire the rights to build a Frers 36 from Canadian builder Hinterhoeller. 36 foot was quite a bit of boat back then; so, two year later, Carroll's commissioned a 33 from Frers, of which ultimately fifty were built. Alas, Carroll Marine, like Hinterhoeler before them, have long ceased trading, but on SOL and IRL – she is a sturdy ship – the Frers 33 sails on!
