Not very glorious, but at the exit, I'm back in third position.

I hope no one noticed my less than academic navigation when going around Dyer Rock and Dyer Island...

In my opinion, it's still too early to be operational, I've been jostled around by events.

However, I somehow manage to maintain my position.

A final tack brings us back to the finish, our starting point.

I choose to stay south behind CriticalHippo, with stronger winds, but an angle that will deteriorate.

Mirek and Patrick choose a more northerly route, with weaker winds but a better TWA at the end.

There was nothing to do to catch up with Critical and Mirek...

On the other hand, I was neck and neck with Patrick, and after taking a small lead, I saw that he was going to come back in the final.
