




Chile Islands RTI Sprint 2025- Race Report by KaSToR

The first two legs allow you to round the buoy off Francisco Island.


It's a bit technical, between positioning yourself south or north of the channel, avoiding the polar trough and a complex tack halfway through the course.




In summary, in Act 2, the hippopotamus and the beaver practically form a common herd.

Hippo's lead must therefore be minimal but sufficient as we approach the end of the course.




Act 3, in summary, It's not looking good, thinks the beaver.
